Mission: VA Stars & Stripes Healthcare Network is part of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. We provide health care and social services to veterans, who have earned and are eligible for those services. There are more than 1.5 million veterans in our service area. This area includes Pennsylvania, Delaware, and several counties in West Virginia, Ohio, New Jersey, and New York. Last year we served over 200,000 patients.

Our goal is to provide care as close to veterans' homes as possible. We offer services in over 40 community-based clinics. Through our "Families Matter" program, we are also committed to involving the family in the veteran's care, whenever appropriate.

Services and Programs: Our Network offers comprehensive services ranging from preventive screenings and checkups to nursing home care. We also have special programs for women, minorities, and Gulf War veterans. Other special programs include:

- Prosthetics
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Spinal Cord Injury or Dysfunction
- Homelessness
- Visual Impairment
- Sexual Trauma Counseling

Our veterans are eligible for a comprehensive, "Uniform Benefits Package" of inpatient and outpatient services. Veterans receiving health care benefits can receive a free ID card showing their eligibility for VA care and services. Services provided within the Uniform Benefits Package include:

- Preventive services
- · Primary health care, diagnosis and treatment
- Surgery, including outpatient surgery
- Rehabilitative services
- Mental health and substance abuse treatment
- · Home health care
- Respite and hospice care
- Urgent and limited emergency care in VA facilities
- Drugs

- Volunteers: Over 5,000 volunteers assist our staff in serving veterans.
 Volunteers spend more than 700,000 hours a year helping veterans. This is the equivalent of 345 full-time employees!

Patient Co-payments and Insurance: Depending on eligibility level, a veteran may be responsible for making co-payments for care and medications. It is important that patients let us know about any insurance they have. The money collected from your insurance helps us provide more and better services to our veterans.
